

Elisa Guidi, PhD, Postdoctoral Scholar, University for Foreigners of Siena (Italy)



Elisa is a current post-doctoral scholar at the University for Foreigners of Siena and a contract professor at the University Institute entitled “Scuola Superiore di Scienze dell’Educazione San Giovanni Bosco” (Institute affiliated with the Salesian Pontifical University in Rome). She is a community psychologist and holds a PhD in Nonlinear Dynamics and Complex Systems from the University of Florence (UNIFI). Previously, she interned at the International Association of Universities (IAU) as part of the mobility agreement between IAU and UNIFI within the project titled “INTERPROCESS 2.0 - Higher education and internationalization: analysis of processes and pathways”.
